

Hitchcock Nature Center is proud to announce a partnership with one of the National Ski Patrol's newest chapters, the Loess Hills Nordic Patrol, a highly trained, volunteer, and non-profit organization formally affiliated with



the National Ski Patrol.

The Loess Hills Nordic Patrol formed in 2016 and bases their operations at Hitchcock Nature Center. Nordic Patrollers possess extensive training and experience in first aid, search and rescue operations, outdoor emergency care, coordinating emergency evacuations, trail maintenance, and many others areas of focus. Their primary role at Hitchcock Nature Center is to ensure the safety of park visitors. they are available to assist park visitors in a variety of emergency situations and their familiarity with the park makes them valuable ambassadors for Hitchcock Nature Center, its history, and its mission.

Nordic Patrollers work closely with Hitchcock Nature Center rangers and staff and have become a valuable member of the Hitchcock Nature Center team; you'll often times find them assisting with some of Hitchcock's larger public events. You can recognize them on the trails or in the parking lot by their uniform pictured below. Patrollers often work in pairs and are in radio contact with park rangers so they are the perfect people to ask if you get into a sticky situation. They're here to assist so please don't hesitate to use their services.
